Homer C. and Martha N. Phifer Endowed Lecture Series

Please mark your calendars for our first-ever program of the Homer C. and Martha N. Phifer Endowed Lecture Series. Thanks to members Sandy and Neilda Storms' generous gift honoring the Phifers dedication and extraordinary service to the church, this series will attract speakers of note to present fresh perspectives on religious topics.

On Sunday, November 8, frequent lecturer, sought-after teacher, and respected author John Wells Kuykendall, Ph.D. will present the inaugural program for the Phifer Lecture Series. This will include preaching at both services on Sunday morning and lecturing on Sunday evening.

An ordained Presbyterian minister, Dr. Kuykendall is the retired president of Davidson College, where he worked for 19 years. He earned a Bachelor of Divinity degree from Union Theological Seminary, and a Master of Sacred Theology at Yale Divinity School. At Princeton University, he received both a master's and doctorate in American religion. Dr. Kuykendall authored numerous articles and reviews as well as two books: *Presbyterians: Their History and Beliefs*, co-authored with Walter L. Lingle, and *Southern Enterprise: The Work of National Evangelical Societies in the Antebellum South*. A Charlotte native, Dr. Kuykendall and Nancy, his wife of 48 years, have two sons.

The evening begins at 5:30 with a catered dinner, and the program begins promptly at 6:30. The cost of the dinner is \$8, and the lecture is free. You will have an opportunity to register for this event in October through a brochure reply card or the Universal Response Form.
