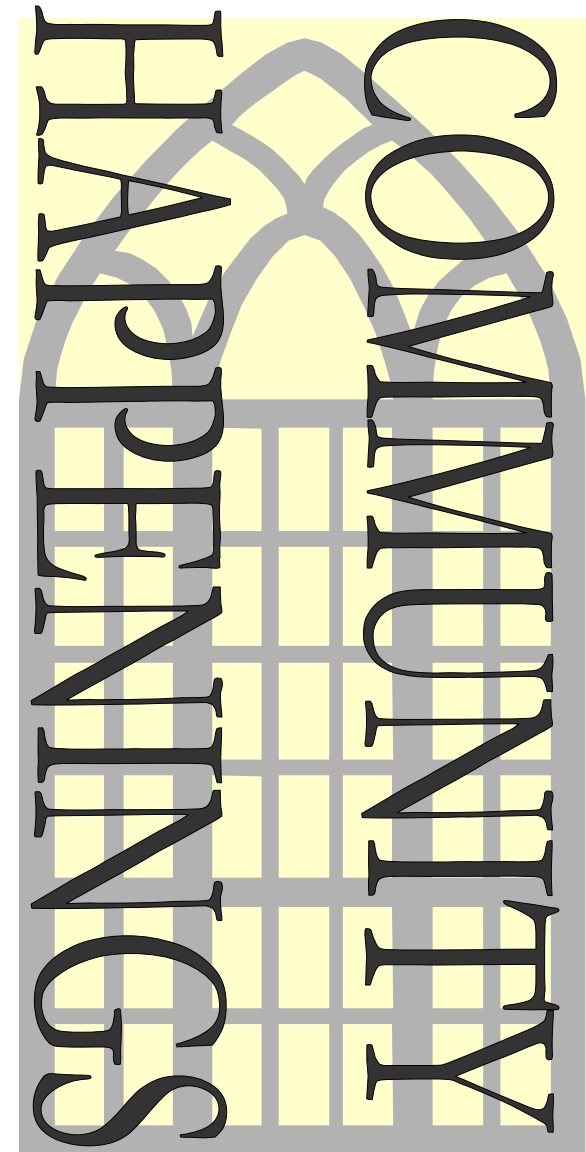

Baby Kit—(for Haiti)



6 — cloth diapers
 2 — T-shirts or undershirts (no onesies)
 2 — washcloths
 2 — gowns or sleepers
 2 — diaper pins
 1 — sweater or sweatshirt
 2 — receiving blankets
 (one can be a hand-knitted or crocheted baby blanket)

All items should be new and under 12 months in size. Wrap items inside one of the receiving blankets and secure with both diaper pins. While cloth diapers are not as commonly used in the United States, they are a necessary part of the layette.
